Summary:

This deliverable describes the structure and implementation of the EuFood-STA Mobility System within the EuFood-STA project to support cooperation between the food industry and academic sector in Europe.



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1 Introduction

EUFooD-STA objective is to establish and provide a required frame for collaborations between the industry and academic sector to enable the exchange of knowledge, demands, ideas, training and staff. The students, higher education teachers as well as food industry staff and professionals would clearly benefit from additional education and need faster access to research results in order to be competitive in the future.

A system will be set up to facilitate the exchange of students and staff between food industry and universities (internships, short term scientific missions (STSM)). This mobility system will be included in the EuFooD-STA website and will provide a platform for students and food industry staff, acting as a contact base providing information about mobility options in Europe.

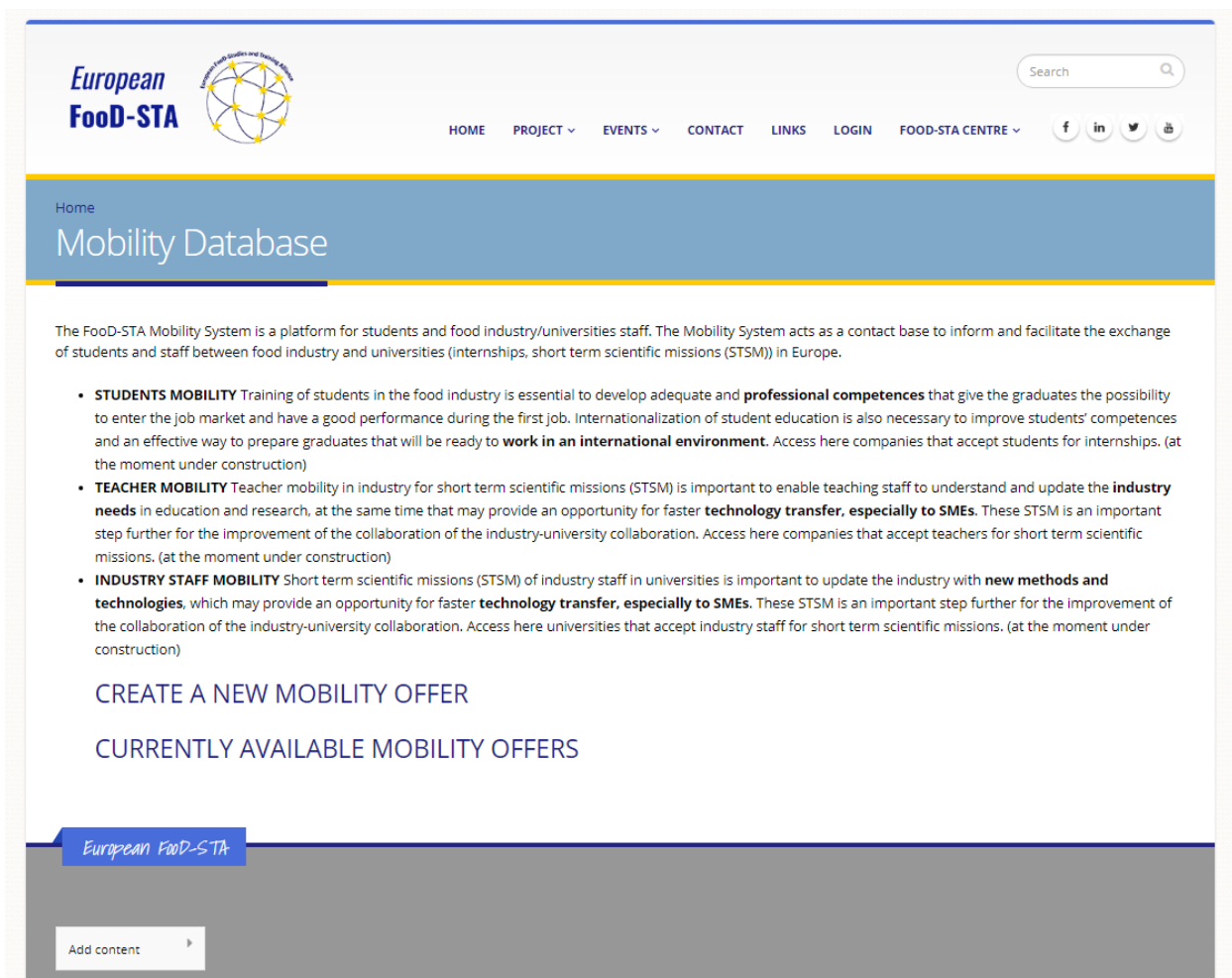



Figure 1. Screenshot of the Mobility System

The mobility system (**Figure 1**) will include one database. In this database, the data can be viewed as **list** (open to the public) and each entry as **table** (also open to the public).

2 Mobility database

The mobility database can be reached by clicking on the “Mobility” bottom at the homepage (<https://www.food-sta.eu/>). **Figure 2** shows a screenshot of the mobility database. The fields of the **list view** are shown below:

- Mobility title**
- Institution Name**
- Country**
- Expiration date**


Each field can be **sorted alphabetically**. The data can also be **filtered** according to mobility title, institution name, country and expiration date. When clicking on mobility title, a table view opens in a new screen, displaying all fields per entry. An example can be seen in **Figure 3**.
